#### **CHURCH ATTENDANCE**

#### **BAPTISMAL PREPARATION CLASSES**

At St. Clare's we ask parents and godparent(s) to attend a Baptismal preparation class.

#### TIMES OF BAPTISM

Baptisms take place on selected Saturdays at 11:00 a.m. The specific date is determined and assigned together with parents and the Parish. Please ensure that a baptismal date is confirmed with the office before booking a venue.

#### **PHOTOGRAPHY**

Please check with the priest celebrant on the day of the Baptism regarding photography etiquette. Photographers are asked to behave in a respectful manner and be mindful of others' need to witness the Baptism.

#### **BAPTISMAL RECORD**

Your child's permanent record will be kept at this parish. A Baptismal certificate will be provided on the day of the Baptism. <u>We ask that you please provide us with a copy of your child's birth certificate along with this form.</u>

#### **CHURCH OFFERING**

It is customary for families to make an offering to the church on the occasion of a child's Baptism. We are grateful for whatever you are able to offer.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION - Please read carefully

#### **Choosing Your Child's Godparents**

In choosing godparents, you may choose one **male** and one **female**, **or** either one godparent alone.

#### A godparent:

must be at least 16 yrs. old
is a <b>practicing</b> Catholic - Confirmed and in Full
Communion with the Church
is a Catholic (Roman or Byzantine Rite) who is leading a life
in harmony with the faith – attending Sunday Mass at a
Catholic Church regularly, receiving communion and the
sacrament of reconciliation (confession) regularly.
if married, must be married in the Church
cannot be the father or mother of the child.

#### **A Christian Witness**

A person who is baptized in a non-Roman Catholic community (ie. Anglican, United, Presbyterian ...) may be a Christian witness <u>as long</u> as a Catholic godparent is also present.

When two people are asked to be godparents or Christian witness, they are to be **male and female**. If you are not sure whether a person is a suitable candidate, please consult the Parish Office **before** asking that person.

<u>Catholics who were baptized Catholic, but are now practicing</u> <u>another faith *may not* act as Christian witness or godparent.</u>

#### (Catholic) SPONSOR Information:

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u> (according to Canon Law 874.11): a GODPARENT must be a practicing Roman Catholic who has received BAPTISM, CONFIRMATION & EUCHARIST and is in good standing with the Church (i.e., not married outside of the Catholic Church; not co-habiting; attending Mass regularly; etc.). He or she must be at least sixteen years of age, can be either a man or a woman (vs. two men or women) and may NOT be the father or mother of the one to be baptized. A NON-CATHOLIC WITNESS (Canon Law 874.2) must be a BAPTIZED person belonging to a non-Catholic Christian faith. This person will NOT be formally called a Godparent, but a Christian Witness. You may have <u>only one</u> Christian witness with <u>only one</u> Catholic Godparent (vs. two Godparents and a Christian Witness or two Christian Witnesses without a Catholic Godparent).
